

Freshman Admissions Requirements

Freshmen are students who are currently attending secondary school or who have not enrolled in classes after graduating from secondary school.

Freshmen students will need to submit the following items to be reviewed for admission at the University of Mount Olive. For the Fall semester (August), the deadline to submit the below items is May 1st. For the Spring semester (January), the deadline is October 1st. Before an I-20 can be issued, your first semester's balance will have to be paid in full.

1. **Application** <http://www.umo.edu/application>
2. **Proof of English ability.** Students may prove their ability with:
 - U.S. High School diploma and transcripts showing you attended a U.S. school for at least 2 years.
 - Official TOEFL (<http://www.toefl.org>) scores.
 - Minimum IBT score of 65
 - Minimum PBT score of 512
 - TOEFL scores must be sent directly from the testing agency to the University of Mount Olive. Our School code is 5435.
 - Official IELTS (<http://www.ielts.org>) score of 6.0
 - Scores must be sent directly from the testing agency to the University of Mount Olive.
 - Written essay with permission
3. **Official School Records and International Credential Evaluation**

U.S. High School Graduates- Please send us a copy of your high school transcripts. You do not need to complete a credential evaluation.

International Secondary School Graduates- Submit an official course-by-course credential evaluation for every school you have attended. You will need to send your official international records to an evaluation company. The company will then send the University of Mount Olive a copy of your transcripts and an evaluation, converting your international grades to their US equivalent and provide an overall Grade Point Average. We recommend using IEE (<http://www.foreigntranscripts.com>) or WES (<https://.wes.org>) for the evaluation.

- We recommend completion of 4 courses of English (or your native language), 4 courses of Mathematics, 3 courses of Science, 2 courses of History/Social Science, and 2 courses of the same Foreign Language (which may be English).
- If you are still completing your high school education at the time of application, you will need to have an evaluation completed, before the appropriate deadline.
- You must also send an updated credential evaluation confirming that you have graduated prior to your enrollment at the University of Mount Olive.

4. **Official FINAL Transcripts of ALL secondary institutions attended** (US equivalent to High School 9, 10, 11, and 12 Grades), showing all grades with the institutions' Official Stamp/Seal **AND** Administrative Signatures.
 - ***Submit the following documents AFTER you have graduated and received your final grades from your current secondary institution.***
 - If the official language of instruction in your country is **NOT** English, you **MUST** provide transcripts in your official language of instruction **AND** English translated Official Transcripts.
 - If your official language of instruction is **NOT** English, Certified English Translators can provide the translation service. It is recommended to submit credentials of the translator with the English translation.

5. **SAT or ACT Score**
 - You will need to submit your SAT or ACT score. The SAT (<http://www.collegeboard.com>) code is 5435 and the ACT (<http://www.act.org>) code is 3131. Students in countries where neither the SAT nor ACT is offered may contact the Office of Admissions AFTER beginning their application to request a test score waiver.
 - Any international student wishing to compete in NCAA athletics **MUST** submit an Official SAT/ACT Score Report, regardless of age or country of origin.
