All MSN students must have a Collaborative Mentor who will provide professional context within their individual MSN courses, their small exploratory research study, and graduate thesis during the student's nursing emersion experience. This Collaborative Mentor will:

- Participate in meetings with the student to review individual course syllabi content, and establish a mutual plan of activity, which enables the student to meet the learning objectives of their MSN curriculum.
- Develop a plan of action with the student to meet individual objectives within the realities of the practice setting, as the breadth and depth of nursing education and nursing administration concepts are discussed in class.
- Assure, with the student, that their small exploratory research study and graduate thesis move towards responsible evidence-based professional practice, and assist the student in molding a nursing emersion experience that facilitates learning, in conjunction with the MSN faculty.
- Participate directly in the overall evaluation of the student's small exploratory research study and graduate thesis completion in conjunction with the MSN faculty via their work email.
- After the student graduates, collaboratively work as a co-author with the student and the MSN faculty member to help facilitate the writing and publication of the student's thesis work in an appropriate peer-reviewed journal.
